In the old Japanese lunar calendar, April is called “Uzuki (卯月),” which corresponds approximately to mid-May to early June in the modern solar calendar.

The name “Uzuki” is believed to originate from the month when the “Utsugi no Hana” (Deutzia flower), also known as “Unohana (卯の花),” blooms. Some Japanese people may recall the elementary school song “Natsu wa Kinu” (Summer Has Come) when thinking of this month.

During this season, April in Japan is in the midst of spring, with lush greenery and Japan’s iconic Sakura (cherry blossoms) blooming beautifully all over Japan.

This month, Ranzan's cuisine is dedicated to Sakura. Our menu is filled with cherry blossom-themed dishes, including sakura tofu, sakura sea bream, sakura sorbet, sakura-pickled daikon, and sakura mochi—cherry blossoms are in full bloom.
